The evaluation of digital libraries, in general, has not received much attention in spite of their number and global audience (Saracevic 2004).

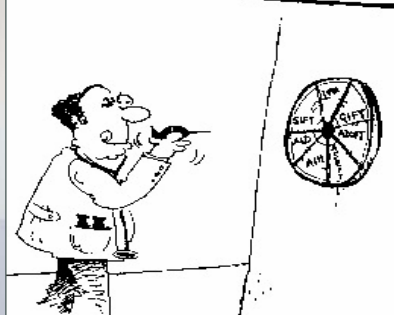



Welcome

This is a web site designed to provide quality research evidence to public health decision makers, saving you time by searching, screening, and rating the systematic review evidence to compile it in a free, searchable online registry: health-evidence.ca. Findings of a research project funded by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research demonstrated a need for a reliable source of review evidence that decision makers in public health could access and use easily. You can read more about studies and ongoing research elsewhere on the site, and you can also read more about the process each review must pass before being posted to health-evidence.ca.

Through this site, you can locate references to review literature in the form of systematic reviews and meta-analyses, gathered through a comprehensive search of electronic databases, journal tables of contents, and reference lists. All reviews in this online registry have been screened for relevance to public health, and appraised for quality. Users can see whether reviews are weak, moderate, or strong. We are also working to provide summary statements for each of the reviews in the registry. A summary statement is a short (2 page) synopsis of the review's content, highlighting key evidence points and implications for practice and policy. Not all reviews in the registry have summary statements at present, but we are working to find funding (and authors!) to fill in the gaps. Full reviews have been located and are linked wherever access is possible through the public domain. Selected reviews are available only to study participants where noted. The integrations of research findings contained in this library were produced in the course of a methodological project entitled "Analytic techniques for qualitative metasynthesis," funded by the National Institute of Nursing Research (2000-2005, NR04907, NR04907S). The purpose of this project was to develop methods for conducting systematic integrations of the findings in qualitative studies, using qualitative studies of women with HIV infection. All qualitative studies of women of any race, ethnicity, nationality, or class, living with HIV infection in the United States were eligible for inclusion.

A digital library, according to Marchionini (2003), is a logical extension and augmentation of a physical library in the electronic information society. Digital libraries may take many forms, and do not necessarily need to include the original full text of a book or journal. They should, however, help transform data into information and knowledge.

This digital library is the product of a vision to provide internet access to syntheses of qualitative research findings for health care providers through user-friendly Web-based tools. The intent is to create a way of disseminating research that health care providers will find easy to use and will want to use.

So, here is the digital library, featuring qualitative studies conducted with HIV-positive women with findings in two major topical areas: stigma and motherhood. Thank you, and enjoy!

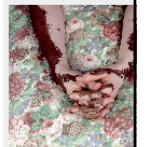

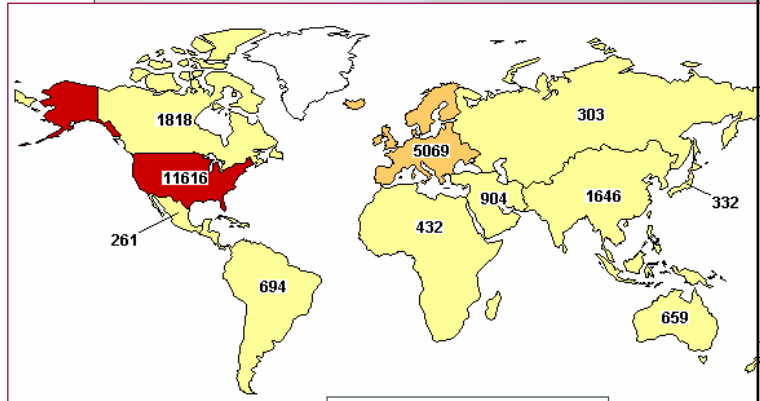
